## Clue #4 – “The Neighbors”

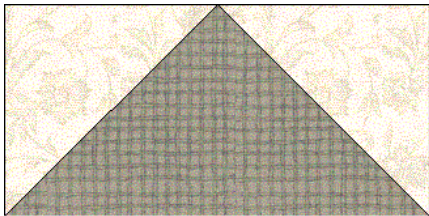
Granny has decided that she must have left those glasses at the neighbors this morning. But which neighbor? She went visiting this morning while looking for her precious Miss Kitty. “Well, they sure ain’t anywhere in this house!” So off she goes to see every neighbor—again.

### Cutting Instructions (for all 14 blocks):

<b>Color #1 Background</b>	Cut 16 – 4 7/8” Squares for Flying Geese units	Cut 28 – 2 1/2” x 10 1/2” Rectangles
<b>Color #2 Lt. Green</b>	Cut 7 – 2 1/2” x 12 1/2” Rectangles	
<b>Color #3 Blue</b>	Cut 2 – 9 1/4” Squares for Flying Geese units	Cut 14 – 2 1/2” x 6 1/2” Rectangles Cut 21 – 2 1/2” Squares
<b>Color #4 Golden Yellow</b>	Cut 14 – 2 1/2” Squares	
<b>Color #5 Red</b>	Cut 14 – 2 1/2” x 4 1/2” Rectangles	
<b>Color #6 Gray</b>	Cut 2 – 9 1/4” Squares for Flying Geese units	Cut 14 – 2 1/2” x 6 1/2” Rectangles Cut 21 – 2 1/2” Squares
<b>Color #8 Dk. Green</b>	Cut 7 – 2 1/2” x 12 1/2” Rectangles	

### Assembly:

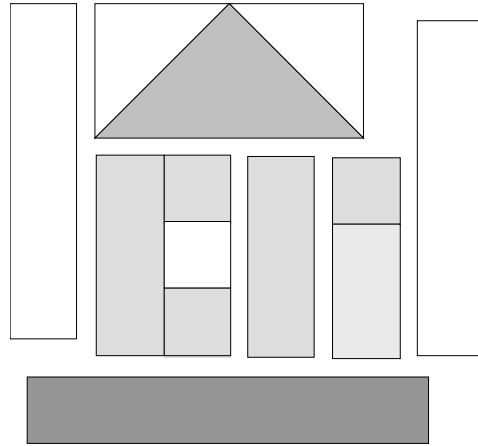
Using the background squares and #3 Blue and #6 Gray 9 1/4” squares, make flying geese units just as we did in clue #2 with the tree blocks. You will have 8 Gray units and 8 Blue units. (Although, you will use only 7 each).



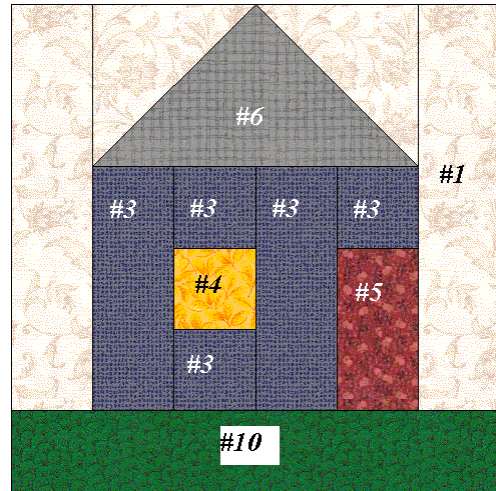
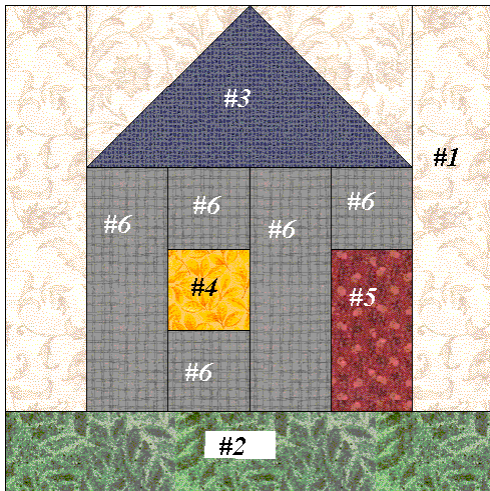
Make 8 each



Now assemble the house blocks by joining a siding square to the top of the #5 red door, and joining two siding squares to the #4 yellow window. Then adding siding rectangles to these units as shown below. The rooftop flying geese units are then added, then the side background pieces, and finally the green grass pieces. You will have two flying geese units left over.



Use the color scheme in the illustrations shown below: Blocks will measure 12 1/2" unfinished.
