

## “HEXAGON SNOWFLAKES”

24” x 24”

Fabrics by Moda: “Shimo” line

You will need 5 Fat Quarters:

2 – large snowflakes prints

1 – dark blue small print for trim

1 – snowballs print for triangles & border

1 - white print for prairie points

$\frac{3}{4}$  yd for backing & batting

Directions:

> “Fussy” cut a large snowflake hexagon for the center. We used a width of 10” across (print out center template) and the length of the Sides should measure  $5\frac{3}{4}$ ”.

> “Fussy” cut 6 small snowflakes 5” squares (3 light and 3 dark)

> Add  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ” trim around the small squares, then trim to measure 6” square.

> Cut 6 – 60° Triangles from snowball print,  $5\frac{1}{2}$ ” tall.

> Layout and then join all pieces together.

> Add  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ” strips of the snowball print around all outside edges, trim corners.

> Cut and create all prairie points by folding 36 - 3” squares twice on the diagonals.

> Pin 3 prairie points to each side segment (pointing to the center of your top). Join to your top with a  $\frac{1}{4}$ ” seam.

> Layer batting on the bottom. Then the back, right side UP. Then the top, right side DOWN. Pin together.

> Stitch all around (use your prairie point seam as your guide) leaving an opening to turn right side out.

> Turn right side out and press smooth. Stitch opening closed.

> Quilt as desired.
